1. **TOURIST INFORMATION:** Who is the famous athlete outside the Tourist Information Office at 90 Wellington Street? **Terry Fox**
2. **NATIONAL ARTS CENTRE:** How many flags are there at the NAC entrance facing the canal? **13**
3. **QUEBEC CYCLE PATH:** What animal is sculpted on one of the three plaques? **Beaver**
4. **BYWARD MARKET:** Draw a design of an Obama cookie available at Le Moulin de Province in the market? **Maple leaf with Canada inscribed**
5. **BYTOWN MUSEUM:** When was the Bytowne Museum built as a commissariat? **1827**
6. **OLD MILL RESTAURANT:** How many shutters are there on the front of the Old Mill Restaurant? **13 (or perhaps 26) both would be accepted**
7. **RIDEAU LOCKS:** How many locks are there in this series of locks going into the Ottawa River? **8**
8. **CENTENNIAL FLAME:** What is the name of the missing territory at the centennial flame? Who lit the flame in 1967? **Nunavut, Pearson**
9. **CAT HOUSE:** Who is the caretaker of the Cat House up on Parliament Hill? **Rene Chartand**
aka The "Catman" of the hill.
10. **WAR MUSEUM:** In what 'language' is 'Lest We Forget' written on the fin of the museum? **Morse Code**
11. **JACQUES CARTIER PARK:** There is a statue of a person wearing skates. Who is it and what year did he join the Privy Council? **Maurice Richard 1992**
12. **CYCLE PATH BELOW PARLIAMENT HILL:** Why should you walk your bicycle on the path below the Supreme Court? **Pedestrian tunnel (with sign saying to walk your bike!)**
13. **FAMOUS 5 MONUMENT:** What was written in the journal on October 18, 1929 by the five famous women located just east of the centre block? **Women are Persons**
14. **NATIONAL ARCHIVES:** What is one of your favourite inscriptions carved on the bench in front of the National Archives? **(there are about 100 inscriptions) Why do I call them the 'modern Adam and Eve'? They're eating an apple**
15. **VICTORIA ISLAND:** How many faces are on the totem pole on the east end of Victoria Island? **6 faces (one is a lot smaller than the others)**
16. **MUSEUM OF CIVILIZATION:** How many of the white statues behind the Museum of Civilization are children? **3**
17. **PORTAGE BRIDGE:** In olden days, how many portages did the fur traders and aboriginals have between Montreal and the Great Lakes? **36**
18. **MAJOR'S HILL PARK:** What statue is looking out over Parliament Hill from Major's Hill Park? **Colonel John By**
19. **TOURIST SHOP:** What is the name of the tourist shop famous for its Canadiana at the corner of Sparks and Metcalfe? **Canada's Four Corners** (It is no longer called Canada's Four Corners but **Gallery 93** - however, most Ottawans would call it Four Corners!)
20. **MUSEUM:** What museum is across the street from the west end of 240 Sparks Street Mall? **Currency**
21. **WAR MEMORIAL:** What are the two items on top of the grave for the unknown soldier? **helmet and sword (There is also a maple branch)**
22. **NEPEAN POINT:** Who is the statue of at the top of Nepean Point? What is the proper name of the item he is holding in his hand? (a very old orienteer or star gazer may know) **Champlian, astrolab**
23. **THE PUMP HOUSE:** What organization looks after the whitewater kayaking course? **Ottawa River Runners**
24. **NATIONAL ART GALLERY:** Is this famous statue of an anthropod having twins, triplets or more? **more(12 eggs in her pouch)**
25. **CONFEDERATION PARK:** What are the five wild animals on the statue commemorating our aboriginal war veterans? **Elk, bison, wolf, eagle, bear**
26. **CHATEAU LAURIER:** What is the name of the room where high tea is served at the Chateau Laurier? Who is this person related to? **Zoe's lounge Wilfrid Laurier's wife**
27. **CANADIAN MINT:** Where are the coins that we use everyday minted? When were the first pieces minted in Ottawa? **Winnipeg , 1908**
